

Health and Safety Plan for Indoor Camps

Instructors and campers will wash their hands on a frequent basis. Hand sanitizer will also be available.

Instructors are required to wear face masks.

Campers will wear face masks when a social distance of at least six feet cannot be maintained.

Class size will be limited to allow for physical distancing.

Physical distancing between campers will be followed whenever feasible.

For cooking camps, children will work in small groups of 4 children. Groups will remain together for the week and will social distance from other groups.

Campers/Groups will have their own equipment whenever possible. Shared equipment will be cleaned before use by another group.

Frequently touched surfaces will be cleaned throughout the day.

Windows will be opened to provide ventilation.

Drop off & Pick up will be curbside. Parents must remain in car.

Parents should screen their child(ren) each morning for signs and symptoms of COVID-19. Signs and symptoms include fever, cough, sore throat, shortness of breath or problems breathing. Do not send your child(ren) if they are ill.

Children exhibiting any signs or symptoms related to COVID-19 will not be admitted to camp.

If a camper becomes ill during the program, they will be isolated from the group. Parents will be notified to pick up the child immediately.

If a confirmed case of COVID-19 is reported, all parents will be notified and the camp will be shut down immediately. The CDC and the Bucks County Board of Health will be contacted for further guidance.
